

Artistic Director's Note

Outside the Ring deals with strong subject matter. The extraordinary friendship between the two boxers cannot be truly understood if the ugly truth about racism in 1930 Nazi Germany and the US is not shown. Our youth cast engaged in a talk about so that they understood the context in which certain words in the story were used.

Synopsis of Act I

PROLOGUE 1954, Chicago, South Side. Schmeling approaches Louis' home.

SCENE I July 17, 1936 Evening of the first fight. Yankee Stadium and Harlem, NY and the Goebbles Residence, Berlin

A crowd files into Yankee Stadium as Louis and Schmeling are in final preparations. Louis is visited by his mother. Schmeling has a call with his wife who is at the Berlin residence of Joseph Goebbles.

American and German sports announcers give details of the fight as all listen in.

Scene II An hour later: Harlem Children reenact the fight in Round 4 when Louis gets knocked down. A boy sobs.

Isolating himself from the press, an injured Louis, accompanied by his trainer Blackburn, arrive at their mutual friend's place. Louis tries to comfort the boy, but the boy recognizes him and insults him.

Blackburn expresses his anger towards Louis for breaking training and being in poor condition. Louis reflects on losing a fight for the first time.

Act I Scene III A week later: Berlin

Goebbels throws a party with Schmeling as guest of honor. Men from the German Office of Propaganda carefully observe Schmeling engage the others. The Goebbles children enter for a propoganda photo.

Schmeling is asked to explain why he was so certain he would defeat Louis when the odds were heavily against him. He explains that his trainer obtained films of Louis' fights, and they discovered a flaw in Louis' technique. However, his words become twisted to appear he believes the flaw to be Louis' race.

Goebbles' wife pulls Anny aside and inquires as to how she can be of service to Germany. In private, Schmeling and Anny express uneasiness at the evening's events.

Goebbels expresses the Führer's distaste for degenerate art. He unveils the vision for the new capital called 'Germania' - a city that will last for 1,000 years.

Magda and an official enter with a document outlining the Nazi party's views on race.

End of Act I

BIOS

Christine Steyer (Artistic Director of Bellissima Opera; *Outside the Ring* Librettist, Director, Narrator; *Speed Dating Tonight!* Dancer, UFO Watcher Dater) is the 2020 Honored Artist of the American Prize for outstanding contributions to the arts. The soprano has received acclaim for her portrayals of Madame Butterfly and Violetta, and has sung in 40 productions at Lyric Opera of Chicago. She recently shared the stage with Lawrence Brownlee, members of the Chicago Symphony and Lyric Opera of Chicago Orchestras, and was featured on WFMT's program *Music Notes: Music of Healing and Peace*. Steyer is an avid recitalist and producer, showcasing unique works by contemporary and women poets and composers. In 2021, she premiered the role of the Rio de Janeiro Health Care Worker in *On Call: COVID-19* and in 2022 premiered the role of Flanna in *Future Perfect*. Steyer served as librettist for these award-winning operas. Steyer has brought music to 24,000 youths in underserved areas with Bellissima Opera's In the Classroom. She is Co-Founder of the vocal alliance Working in Concert, and Artistic Director of its Bellissima Opera initiative. Christine is on the music faculty at Concordia University and teaches music at Ascension Catholic School in Oak Park. She is thrilled to share her deep love of music with a new generation of young people. She lives in Oak Park with her husband Paul and their beloved rescue dog Huckleberry. In her free time, she loves to garden, paint and travel around the world.

Carl Ratner (President of Working In Concert, Associate Artistic Director of Bellissima Opera; *Outside the Ring* Joe Jacobs (Schmeling's Manager); *Speed Dating Tonight!* Stage Director, Bar Regular) began his career assisting directors at the world's major opera houses, including Covent Garden in London, the Metropolitan Opera in New York, the Munich Opera, the Spoleto Festival in Italy, and Lyric Opera of Chicago, among others. He served as Artistic Director of Chicago Opera Theater (1994-1999) and Chamber Opera Chicago (1985-1993). An accomplished baritone, he has portrayed the title roles in Verdi's *Falstaff*, Puccini's *Gianni Schicchi*, and Britten's *Noye's Fludde*, as well as Papageno in *The Magic Flute*, John Proctor in *The Crucible*, and the leading baritone roles in *Madama Butterfly* and *Turandot*. A frequent soloist in oratorio and recital, he has performed Handel's *Messiah*, Orff's *Carmina Burana*, and many other concert works. He has sung in 14 languages and has performed in 7 countries, 10 states, and the District of Columbia. He created the role of Oxóssi in the world premiere of *Future Perfect* and directed and created the role of the Lebanon Health Care Worker in the world premiere of *On Call: COVID-19* for Bellissima Opera. He recently directed Verdi's *La Traviata* and performed the role of the Doctor for South Bend Lyric Opera. He studied at Oberlin, Northeastern Illinois University, Northwestern, Juilliard, and the Saint Petersburg Conservatory in Russia through a Fulbright grant. He retired from his position as Co-Chair of Voice and Director of Opera at Western Michigan University in 2023.

David Shenton (*Outside the Ring* Composer) is an English pianist, violinist, composer, and arranger, based in New York. Shenton has collaborated with musicians in diverse genres, including Vanessa Williams, Tony Bennett, Sierra Boggess, Denyce Graves, Renée Fleming, Sherrill Milnes, Sir André Previn, Alan Menken and Stephen Schwartz. Composing since the age of nine, Shenton has written hundreds of works including sonatas, concerti, a symphony, an oratorio, string quartets, numerous songs, instrumental works, and operas. Shenton's career includes conducting his orchestra/big band at Carnegie Hall in 2014; Jazz@Lincoln Center Rose Theater as a jazz pianist in 2008; classical piano at Lincoln Center's Rubenstein Atrium for the 200th anniversary Schumann and Chopin celebration; and as music director/arranger/pianist for the Center's 100th Anniversary of the sinking of the Titanic. A prolific arranger, Shenton has worked at Abbey Road and CTS Studios (London), on Hollywood movies, and Broadway shows. Shenton has co-created more than a dozen shows with lyricist Martin

Charnin (*Annie*). He arranged and orchestrated for the long-running West End production of Howard Blake's *The Snowman*, for Charnin's last musical, *Robin Hood: The Untold Story*, and for *Opus X*, with trumpeter Chris Botti. Shenton has composed numerous art songs and collaborated with Christine Steyer on *Six Songs for Soprano* as well as two other operas from their Tales of Transcendence series, *On Call: COVID-19* and *Future Perfect*. As a coach, accompanist, and teaching professor, David has been on the faculties of NYU, The New School, The Lee Strasberg Theatre & Film Institute, Mannes College of Music, St. Thomas Choir School and Grace Church School. His catalog of some 45 recordings can be found on various record labels including Steinway & Sons and Vocalion.

Michael Ching (Speed Dating Tonight! Composer) is an American composer, conductor, and music administrator. A prolific and eclectic composer, he is best known nationally as the composer of innovative operas, including his a cappella adaptation of Shakespeare's A Midsummer Night's Dream (2011). His other major operas include Buoso's Ghost (1996), Corps of Discovery (2003), Slaying the Dragon (2012), Speed Dating Tonight! (2013), and Alice Ryley (2015). He has written the librettos for all of his operas composed after 2012. Buoso's Ghost has recently been performed at Florida Grand Opera, Detroit Opera, and Opera Delaware. Recent university productions include Montclair State University and California State University at Fullerton. Speed Dating Tonight! has been performed over 120 times since its premiere at the Janiec Opera at the Brevard Music Festival. EC Schirmer has recently published Michael's Arrangements and Derangements of Schubert, which was commissioned by the ARK Trio and recorded on Navona Records. Michael's other operatic projects include Completing the Picture, Dinner 4 3 (with librettist Deborah Brevoort), Eight Woods and a Van, Anna Hunter, Birthday Clown, Royal Feast, RSBE, and Thrivers. Michael is the opera and art song consultant at E.C. Schirmer and Galaxy Music. He is on the board of directors of the National Opera Association and for 18 years was Artistic Director of Opera Memphis.

Peter Stigdon (*Outside the Ring* Pianist; *Speed Dating Tonight!* Pianist, Crush Apples Dater) is an Oak Park based multi-instrumentalist. He received a BA in Music from Concordia University, where he currently directs Männerchor, the University men's choir. Peter is also the Worship Coordinator and Music Director at Trinity Lutheran Church in Roselle, IL and Harpist with the Symphony of Oak Park and River Forest. This is his second production with Bellissima Opera, having been rehearsal accompanist and appearing as "Kai" in *Future Perfect*.

Brian Burkhardt (Conductor) earned a Bachelor of Music degree in Vocal and Instrumental Music Education from Luther College and a Master of Arts degree in Vocal Performance and Conducting from the University of Iowa. He is currently the director of Vocal Music at Clear Creek Amana schools and has conducted Chamber Opera Chicago productions of *The Sound of Music* and the children's chorus for numerous productions of *Amahl and the Night Visitors*. Also an active performer, he has performed with Chamber Opera Chicago as Charles in the original musical adaptation of Jane Austen's *Persuasion* throughout its eight tours of the UK and Canada and in *Amahl and the Night* Visitors. He has also sung with the Cedar Rapids Opera, University of Iowa Opera Theater, and Dorian Opera, where his roles have included Bill/*The Telephone*, Bob/*Old Maid and the Thief*, Masetto/*Don Giovanni*, Guglielmo/*Cosi fan tutte*, Belcore/*Elixir of Love*, Luiz/*The Grondoliers*, Alfio/*Cavalleria rusticana*, Demetrius/*Midsummer Night's Dream*, Morales/*Carmen*, Prince/*Goose Girl*, and Marquis d'Obigny/*La Traviata*. He has also soloed with the AIMS Festival Orchestra in Graz, Austria, Cedar Rapids Symphony, Southeast Iowa Symphony, and the UI Symphony and Choruses.

Baritone **Ryan de Ryke** (*Outside the Ring* Max Schmeling (German Boxer); *Speed Dating Tonight!* OMG Happy Birthday Dater) is an artist whose versatility and unique musical presence have made him increasingly in demand on both sides of the Atlantic. He has performed at many of the leading international music festivals including the Aldeburgh and Edinburgh Festivals in the UK and the summer festival at Aixen-Provence in France garnering significant acclaim as both a recitalist and singing actor. Ryan studied at the Peabody Conservatory with John Shirley Quirk, the Royal Academy of Music in London with Ian Partridge, and at the National Conservatory of Luxembourg with Georges Backes. His is also an alumnus of the Britten-Pears Institute in the UK and the Schubert Institute in Austria where he worked with great artists of the song world such as Elly Ameling, Wolfgang Holzmair, Julius Drake, Rudolf Jansen, and Helmut Deutsch. Although Ryan's first love is song, he is also known for his work in the Early Music community. His performances with Haymarket Opera have been heralded by the Chicago Tribune among their top 5 list. Ryan is also an accomplished recording artist who rose to attention with his first CD, "A Wanderer's Guitar," on which he collaborates with guitarist Brandon Acker to present Schubert songs. He also appears on the CD "Final Fantasy, Distant Worlds," conducted by Arnie Roth of Mannheim Steamroller. During the pandemic, Ryan starred as the eponymous role in a film of Handel's *Apollo and Dafne*, which was streamed by The Metropolitan Opera and The Royal Opera House Covent Garden. Ryan is particularly proud of his latest CD released by Naxos with pianist Eva Mengelkoch including songs by Albrecht Mendelssohn. The American Record Guide hails his "warm and expressive" singing while Fanfare declares that *Des Knaben Wunderhorn* "fits the baritone like a glove".

Baritone Bill McMurray (Outside the Ring Joe Louis (American boxer); Speed Dating Tonight! Car Man, Ex Duet Dater) has been described as "a baritone with warm, rich tones and superb stage presence". He has more than forty operatic roles to his credit, including Figaro in Il Barbiere di Sivigila, Count Almaviva in Le nozze di Figaro, and Escamillo in Carmen. As Marcello in La Boheme, Walter Marini of the New Buffalo Times described him as "a powerful actor who brings great elegance to the role. His singing is as fine as anything being heard in major opera houses today." He has sung with noted companies like Florida Grand Opera, Opera North, Knoxville Opera, Skylight Music Theater, Opera Company of NC, Mobile Opera, Opera Carolina, Central City Opera and Opera on the James. Recent engagements include his return to Chicago Opera Theater to perform the role of Mr. Gedge in Albert Herring, Marullo in Rigoletto and Pirate King in Pirates of Penzance with Opera San Antonio, Ebn-Chakia in Tchaikovsky's Iolanta, Father in the Midwest premiere of Stefan Weisman's The Scarlet Ibis, and the Narrator in The Snowman with the Illinois Philharmonic. Equally at home on the concert stage, his solo highlights include a Porgy and Bess concert, as well as performances of the Messiah with Michigan City and the Apollo Chorus, the Mozart Requiem with the Chicago Bar Association, and Beethoven's Ninth Symphony with South Bend Symphony and the Illinois Philharmonic. At the Ravinia Festival he was the bass soloist in Haydn's Creation, conducted by James Levine. He was a first place winner of the National Association Teachers of Singing competition and was one of eight singers selected to the Winners Circle of the Classical Music Vocal Competition.

Elizabeth Fisher (Outside the Ring Annie Ondra (Schmeling's wife); Speed Dating Tonight! Fragile Woman Dater) praised for her attractive voice and unique timbre, is a rising young soprano in the Chicago opera scene. Recently she made her company debut with the Gilbert and

Sullivan Opera Company of Chicago, playing the role of Ruth and covering Rose in their production of *Ruddigore*. As a young artist, Ms. Fisher has performed with Folks Operetta, Candlelight Concerts, Utah Festival Opera, Opera in the Ozarks, and Florida State University, and her recent credits include Lucia (*Lucia di Lammermoor*), Mabel (*Pirates of Penzance*), Frasquita (*Carmen*), and Pamina (*The Magic Flute*). Ms. Fisher has received awards and recognition from the Michael Ballam Vocal Competition, the Pasadena Vocal Competition, and the Metropolitan Opera Laffont Competition.

Emily Mwila (Outside the Ring Lillie Barrow (Louis' mother); Speed Dating Tonight! Adjust to the Times Dater) is a New Zealand-born soprano currently based in Chicago. She was part of the original revival cast of Anthony Davis' The Life and Times of Malcolm X with Detroit Opera, Omaha Opera, and the Metropolitan Opera. In 2021, she appeared in the chorus of Porgy and Bess at the Metropolitan Opera. She made her Lyric Opera of Chicago debut singing the role of Evelyn/Fire Shut Up in My Bones (2021/22) and has subsequently sung Lucia Paret/Champion (2023/24) and been the soprano soloist in Lyric Opera's concert performance of Mozart's Thamos, King of Egypt (23/24). She made her operatic debut in New Zealand at Eternity Opera (Zerlina/Don Giovanni), and other roles include Susanna/Le Nozze di Figaro, Mae Jones/Street Scene, and Euridice/Orfeo ed Euridice. Mwila received a Master of Music and Professional Studies Diploma in Voice from Mannes School of Music in New York.

Brian Pember (Joseph Goebbels, German Minister of Propaganda) is delighted to return to Bellissima Opera for this exciting Double-Header performance, having previously performed as Leggo in *Future Perfect*. Brian is an alumnus of Westminster Choir College (*17) where they studied with Charles Walker. They most recently appeared onstage as a guest artist at NEIU in their production of *The Grand Duchess of Gérolstein* (Fritz). They also recently appeared on the art song performance *Present Musings*, which is still available on YouTube. Other credits include Evanston Chamber Opera's *The Chalet* (Daniel), Thompson Street Opera Company's *We've Got Our Eye on You, Michigan Trees* (Mother of Trees), and *The Boy Who Wanted to be a Robot* (Cleano), Chicago Opera Theater's *The Nose, The Life and Death(s) of Alan Turing, Quamino's Map*, and *Moby Dick*, and the Gilbert and Sullivan Opera Company of Chicago's *Pirates of Penzance* (Frederic). Look out for Brian this fall in The *Pure and the Impure* with Working in Concert!

Mezzo-soprano **Jules Furgal** (*Outside the Ring* Magda Goebbels (Goebbels' wife); *Speed Dating Tonight!* Waitress) recently graduated from DePaul University with a Bachelor of Music in Voice Performance under the instruction of Linda DiFiore. They have been seen as a concert soloist with the DePaul Concert Choir numerous times, and was recently featured on DePaul Concert Orchestra's concert as a soloist singing Composer's Aria. Opera credits include ensemble in Mozart's *Cosi Fan Tutte* and Laura in Weill's *Street Scene* with DePaul Opera Theatre. In summer of 2023, Jules studied the Italian language and Italian opera in Urbino, Italy with Musica Nelle Marche. There, they were an active participant in the scenes program, performing the roles of Meg Page (*Falstaff*), Isabella (*L'Italiana in Algeri*), Cherubino (*Le Nozze Di Figaro*) and the titular role in *Cenerentola*. Jules is also fluent in Polish and is studying German. Jules greatly enjoys studying music by Polish composers to further connect with their Polish Heritage. Alongside this, Jules also prioritizes learning music by BIPOC and women composers and strives to continue working to make classical music a more equitable space for all. In the past, Jules has attended workshops including Global Musician's Workshop studying folk music from around the world, and Natalie Weiss' Musical Theatre Masterclass for Classical Singers. Jules hopes to establish themself as a multi-faceted musician who creates art that connects to audiences of all ages.

Bass-baritone **Dorian McCall** (*Outside the Ring* Jack Blackburn (Louis' Trainer); *Speed Dating Tonight!* Bartender) has been mentioned by the New York Times for "his rich lows" and by Musical America as "[benefitting] from his freely produced bass-baritone and his winning stage presence." Noted for his vibrant and robust timbre, the dexterity of McCall's instrument also lends itself well to Baroque and Bel Canto. Hot on the heels of a charged reception at Teatro Nuovo as Fabrizio in Ricci's *Crispino e la comare*, this season included Haymarket Opera's production of *La liberazione di Ruggiero dall'isola d'Alcina*, Gilbert and Sullivan of Chicago's *Ruddigore*, and Cedar Rapids Opera as Resident Teaching Artist as well as a premiere on their stage as Angelotti in Puccini's *Tosca*. Concert work included Chicago Chamber Choir as soloist for Brahms' *Ein deutsches Requiem* and a debut with Handel Choir of Baltimore (*Messiah*) YouTube: @finally_Dorian. Last season, McCall performed with Haymarket Opera as comprimari in Monteverdi's *L'incoronazione di Poppea*, workshopped an opera premier with Chicago Fringe Opera, and debuted with UIC Choirs as a soloist for Handel's *Messiah*. Spring had surprise debuts with Music of the Baroque as a soloist for Bach's *St. Matthew Passion* and Big Spring Symphony for a concert celebrating their 50th season as well as placing 2nd in the Classical Young Artist/Emerging Pro division of the Classical Singer Vocal Competition.

Bass Paul Geiger (Outside the Ring Clem McCarthy (American Broadcaster), Ludwig Haymann (German Propaganda Office) sang the title roles in Marriage of Figaro and Turk in Italy, Belcore in Elixir of Love and Mustafa in Italian Girl in Algiers with Chicago Opera Theater, as well as Olin Blitch in Susannah, the Four Villains in The Tales of Hoffman, and the title role in Sweeney Todd with Des Moines Metro Opera. Other career highlights include Jokanaan in Salome with Palm Beach Opera and Hobson in Peter Grimes with Lyric Opera of Chicago and San Francisco Opera. He has recently performed as Germont in La Traviata and Sharpless in Madama Butterfly with Bellissima Opera, Reverend Hale in The Crucible with Chamber Opera Chicago, the roles of both the Notary and Commissioner in Der Rosenkavalier with Sinfonia da Camera, and Admiral Croft and Major Domo in a new musical adaptation of Jane Austen's Persuasion with Chamber Opera Chicago, which has toured internationally in the UK, Canada, and New York City.

Soprano **Nicole Cooper-Hoke** (*Outside the Ring* Ensemble; *Speed Dating Tonight!* Cell Phone Dater) is a winner of multiple vocal competitions. She was a national finalist for Lyric Opera Theater where she made it to the top 8 and competed at Carnegie Hall.
